

7.1.10.Code of Conduct

Code of Conduct for Students:

The Institute is a temple of learning:

- All the students who have been admitted must act in a dignified manner so that the prestige of Institute, their parents or their own is not compromised.
- Our students assume an obligation to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with the Institute's norms.
- They should behave respectfully with others. The students must strictly follow the following code of conduct.
- **Dress Code:** The students are required to follow the dress code while they are in the campus on all six days. This will keep all the students belonging to different economic strata at a common footing.
- **Discipline:** The students should maintain proper discipline and decorum in the premises of the Institute.
- Involvement in ragging is strictly prohibited as per the directives of the Govt. of India and the Supreme Court.
- Absence from classes and hostels without permission is an offence
- Use of drugs/alcohol/tobacco etc. in the institute/hostel is strictly prohibited.
- Malpractices/using unfair means during test/examination or knowingly furnishing false information is punishable.
- Possession or use of weapons, explosives, fireworks or items of destruction is strictly banned within the campus.
- Conservation of Natural Resources is mandatory.
- Wastage of water, electricity and other raw material is strictly prohibited.
- **Cleanliness:** Every student is expected to maintain general cleanliness within classrooms, laboratories, corridors, canteen, hostel and the campus in general.
- They cannot indulge in any activity having grave ramification on the reputation of the Institute.
- Participation in Extra-Curricular Activities: Every student is expected to participate in one or more co-curricular activity in the institute.
- **Safety:** Student should understand that upkeep of all equipment, including computers, OHP, LCD etc. and electrical fittings in classrooms laboratories, hostels are for their benefit and they are jointly responsible for their safety, upkeep and maintenance.
- They are expected to follow all safety precautions required during work in laboratories and workshops.
- **Respect for Others:** Students must take care that his/her behaviour is impeccable toward the opposite gender. Any unwelcome behaviour towards other students and

employees in written, spoken, gestural or physical directly or indirectly would be dealt with as per the Law.

- **Social Responsibility:** The life of a student is not about scoring marks or grades and passing through examinations. They have to be socially responsible and serve the society. They have to be involved in social services. Ethical Behaviour: Ethical behaviour includes honesty, integrity, respect, Open-mindedness, Discipline, tolerance, Team spirit, Sense of responsibility, fairness and a variety of other positive traits.
- Students should strive to maintain ethical behaviour in his/her personal, social and professional interactions.

- **Code of Conduct for Faculty:**

Teachers are the backbone of any institute. They are the role models for their students and should always remember that they are being watched in and out of the classrooms by their students. The code of conduct for faculty involves matters related with teaching learning process, research activities, assessment of students, relationship with management, fellow colleagues, staff, students and their parents, other professional and educational bodies.

- It is expected that all the teachers will take keen interest in the overall development of personality of the students and their own.
- Seek to make professional growth continuous through study and research.
- Teachers should perform experiments with their own hands before asking the students to perform.
- For expending knowledge a teacher should utilize all resources and avenues available to him. Teachers must maintain complete record of the experiments performed, report submitted and grades earned by the students. Apart from regular teaching it is expected that the teachers will take keen interest in other extra-curricular activities like games, sports, drama, debates, group discussions, fine arts, cultural activities, seminars, conferences, symposium and workshops.
- Teachers are encouraged to attend seminars/conferences/workshops attended, paper presented in any research journal or in conferences.
- Co-operate and assist in carrying out functions relating to the educational responsibilities of the Institute such as: assisting in appraising applications for admission, advising and counselling students, accompany students on educational tour as well as assisting the conduct of university and Institute examinations, including supervision, invigilation and evaluation
- Manage their private affairs in a manner consistent with the dignity of the profession.
- Teachers should discharge their professional responsibilities according to the existing rules and adhere to procedures and methods consistent with their profession in initiating steps through their own institutional bodies and/or professional organizations for change of any such rule detrimental to the professional interest.
- Faculty must undertake additional or administrative duties assigned in the departments and the Institute.

- Various forms of misconduct: Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal conduct) based on an individual's gender, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, colour, region, language, disability, or sexual orientation, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity, etc.
- Intentionally damaging or destroying Institute property or property of other faculty /staff members.
- The teacher shall not avoid any work related to the University/Institute examinations without reasonable grounds.
- Every faculty is expected to maintain general cleanliness within staff room, classrooms, laboratories, corridors, canteen, hostel and the campus in general.
- Faculty member and all other staff members are expected to follow all safety precautions required during work in laboratories and workshops.
- They would follow all rules and regulations related to road safety also

- **Code of Conduct for Departmental Heads**

- The HODs will coordinate all the academic and administrative activities in their respective departments.
- They will provide effective leadership and set precedence in their respective departments so that their younger colleagues feel proud and follow them.
They must arrive in the Institute at scheduled time and should remain available to their faculty and students during working hours...

The HODs at regular intervals inspect the course files, attendance registers of faculty members and ascertain whether the course is covered adequately and to the satisfaction of students. They should record their initials with date on the course file and discuss with the faculty regarding short comings, if any, for improvement.

- The HODs for proper functioning of laboratories, will appoint laboratory in-charges who will look after the development activities in the labs. The HODs in consultation with lab in-charges will finalize the list of equipment required. They will also inspect the labs at regular intervals and see to it that the labs are properly maintained and the experiments are performed systematically and methodically.

The HODs will also inspect the sample lab records of the students and ascertain whether these are checked and evaluated regularly and the faculty members are holding pre experiment and post-experiment Viva.

The HODs will see to it that the projects which the students are required to carry out during final semesters are well thought about in advance by the project guides and should be allocated to the students by the end of III semester or at the beginning of IV semester.

- The HODs must regularly obtain reports from the faculty after every unit/midterm test whether the course outcomes and programme outcomes have been achieved.

Code of Conduct & Responsibilities for Principal

- Planning and implementation of all academic programmes such as refresher/orientation course, seminars, conferences, workshops, faculty development programmes, short term training programmes, expert lectures etc. to be organized for the development of faculty and students.
- Participation in teaching and research programmes of the Institute.
Planning for admissions of the students and maintenance of discipline in the institute.
Correspondence with outside institutions like UGC/Affiliating University/Govt. and other institutes within and outside the country.
- Supervision of internal and University examinations and all such matters pertaining to the examinations.
- Administration and supervision of curricular, co-curricular and extra activities conducted in the Institute.

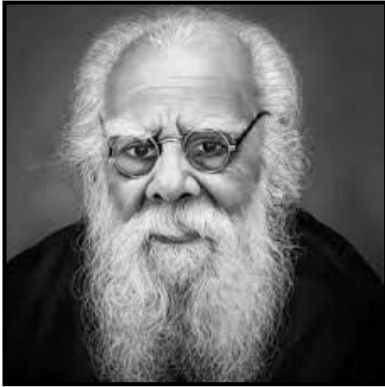

3. THANTHI PERIYAR E.V.R.



Hero of India's freedom struggle, Erode Singam, an unparalleled thinker of the 20th century, who fought to root out superstitions. He was born on 17.09.1879 to an Erode businessman Venkatappa Nayak and Chinnathayam.

Realizing that social emancipation is more important than political emancipation, he changed his field of struggle and strove for social welfare.

He strongly condemned atrocities committed in the name of God and religion.

He was called the Vaikam Warrior because he fought in a town called Vaikam in Kerala state to eradicate untouchability. He insisted that women should get education to establish women's rights. A person who motivated to think rationally about anything. He lived a very simple life and gave the wealth he earned in public life to the society. A wonderful man who lived with the high qualities of morality, honesty, punctuality, frugality, and who never feared to tell the truth.

He also reformed the Tamil Language. He advocated intercaste marriage to eradicate the caste system. He served like a lamp to cultivate self respect and instill reason till he breathed his last. There was no part in Tamil Nadu that was left untreated by this great seer. He died due to ailment on 24.12.1973.

This college came into existence due to the gift of such a saint.

4. HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Tiruchirappalli town has many colleges which caters to Higher education. However, as the number of students is increasing day by day, many do not get the opportunities to study. Absence of a government college in the city was a major drawback, especially for the students of the lower and backward classes to get higher education.

Thanthai Periyar, who was passionate about the educational development of students belonging to poor families had a long-term wish of establishing a Government College. Benefactor Periyar donated Rs.3.5 lakhs, 9.65 acres of land and the Lanka building to the Government of Tamil Nadu for the education of poor students in the city.

The Tamil Nadu government willingly accepted and acquired the nearby buildings and land to construct the student hostel and college buildings and thus this college came into existence. After purchasing new lands, the area of the college increased to 52.62 acres.

In 1965 the classes and laboratories worth Rs.16.5 lakhs was built and raised. On 24.08.1965, the then Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Mr. M. Bhaktavatchalam opened this college, officially.

The college is located near Kajamalai, three kilometers from Tiruchirappalli railway junction. To reach this college one has to come via Mannarpuram Nal Road or Jamal Mohammed College. Tiruchirappalli Law College and Bharathidasan University campus are also close to this college. To the north of the college is the Anna Stadium, Youth Hostel and Scheduled Class / Tribal Class Hostel.

The college has been functioning autonomously since the academic year 1998-99. On the basis of the allocation of funds for the construction of new buildings in government colleges on the occasion of the centenary of the Hon'ble former Chief Minister Arignar Anna of Tamil Nadu, the Government of

Tamil Nadu allocated fund for 18 classrooms and 2 science laboratories which were completed in the year 2009.

Mr. N. Siva, MA, B.L., a Member of Parliament and an ex-student of this college, contributed a grant of Rs.50 lakhs under the local development scheme. With this grant, a well equipped auditorium was constructed in the college campus in 2010.

Also, for the construction of a modern rest room for the female students of this college, Rs.20,00,000/- has been allocated and is being constructed. Anna Centenary Fund Rs.100 lakhs has been allocated and 21 classrooms have been constructed in the year 2010.

5. EMBLEM OF THE COLLEGE



The symbol of our college expresses the pride, culture and spirit of our country. To illustrate that this college is a government college, the symbol of the Tamil Nadu government the Gopuram is seen in the left corner. And this symbol expresses the idea that students should rise as high as the Gopuram in terms of cultural heritage, knowledge and innovation.

Next to it is the lotus flower and elephant symbols which represent Indian culture and tradition. Also, during the initial period, the college bore the elephant symbol to signify its affiliation with the University of Chennai. Moreover, the elephant is used to show the qualities of knowledge, honesty, patience, pride, goodwill, generosity, and great appearance.

It is significant that the people of India harbour these qualities. The poet Bharathidasan's statement that an elephant may appear to be very big but shows its prowess with modesty, in the same way the students of this college should be knowledgeable and humble like the elephant.

In the Indian mainland, the flowers are considered auspicious and especially the lotus. Hence the lotus flower has a place in the college emblem. This flower, combined with red and white, represents prosperity and wealth. This symbol is seen as a symbol of purity and encourages students to live a pure and ideal life. The open book on the top of the lotus indicates the intention of the students to increase their knowledge without rest.

Among these three symbols, Malaikottai Temple and Theppakulam, which are located below, indicate the pride of Tiruchirappalli city. Under it, the rhetoric that can be found in the book as *Pakuthunar* is taken from Bharatiyar

and is based on the principle that students should seek the truth and analyze any book and live their lives with a goal.

It is a special thing that the logo of our college is based on this concept which shows that the teachers and students should strive towards success every day so that this proud educational institution can provide great knowledge.

6. AUTONOMOUS COLLEGE MANAGEMENT

Our college is one of the government colleges which became autonomous in the academic year 1998-99. It is autonomous to function as a small university limited by the approval of the University Finance Board. The foundations of this are 1. Executive Committee, 2. Governing Body of the college. Apart from these, there are committees like Finance Committee, Selection Committee and Disciplinary Control Committee for the smooth functioning of the autonomous college.

Executive Committee

The executive committee consists of the Principal of the college as the secretary and three members appointed by the Tamil Nadu government. It will also include one member appointed by the University Finance Committee and one member appointed by the Bharathidasan University.

Its functions include appointing various committees for the development of the college and fixing the college fees as recommended by the Finance Committee to enhance the autonomy of the college.

Board of Education

The governing body consists of all Heads of departments and four senior professors with the Principal as the Chairman. Also, every expert from the fields of industry, law, education, medicine and engineering will be nominated by the executive committee and will be placed in this committee. Along with this, three University professors are appointed as members by the university.

Some of the functions of this committee are sanctioning the tuition fees recommended by the Finance Committee, sanctioning the commencement of new degree and diploma courses in the college in due course, establishing various scholarship schemes, prizes and books for the students, and maintaining discipline.

8. ADMISSION RULES OF STUDENTS

1. The admission of students in various courses will be done every year as per the orders issued by the government from time to time.
2. Each student's admission is provisional. The admission of the student will be confirmed only after acceptance by the university. If it is not accepted by the university or higher education institution, the name of the student will be removed from the college. The amount paid by the student at the time of admission to the college is also non-refundable. The college will not be held responsible for any financial loss or loss of student learning opportunities due to this.

3. Students studying in this college after obtaining alternative certificates from other colleges will not be admitted in the second and third years. But if those working in the government get transferred to Tiruchirappalli, their son or daughter will be admitted only if the principal allows them to join the particular class.

9. IDENTITY CARDS

All the students admitted to this college will be given identity cards. Students should wear the ID card inside the college every day. Students who do not bring their identity card will not be allowed inside the college premises.

10. TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

1. Students have to apply for Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate in the prescribed form.
2. Students must obtain no dues certificates in all departments, including the public library and the National Student Corps Office.
3. If a student withdraws from the college in the middle of a semester, the student will not be able to get the amount paid.
4. A transfer certificate and conduct certificate will be issued to a student only if he/she pays all the fees in full along with the penalty fee during the academic year or within one year of withdrawal from the college. If you apply after one year, you will have to pay a penalty fee of Rs.6 to get a certificate.

11. ATTENDANCE

1. According to the Semester system, a minimum of 90 working days per Semester is mandatory.
2. Only those students who have attended as per the university norms for each term will be allowed to appear for the autonomous examination.

3. Students with 75-100% attendance will be allowed to write the exam without any penalty fee.
4. Students with 70-74% attendance should pay the condonation fee.
5. Students with 60-69% attendance have to submit medical certificate along with condonation fee.
6. Candidates with less than 60% attendance will not be allowed to appear for examination.

A student leave application should contain the following information.

1. Name of the student
2. Class & Section Practical
3. Date of Leave
4. Reason for Leave
5. Leave taken till now
6. Signature of a student
7. Signature of a Parent / Guardian
8. Signature of Tutor-in-charge

12. PRACTICAL EXAMINATIONS

1. The university will not issue a certificate of practical training if the laboratory practical training is not completed by the students.
2. Students should pay enough attention to carry out proper laboratory practical training.
3. Notes should not be written on a separate sheet of paper during practice under any circumstances.
4. Students should use the training manuals decided by the Heads of Departments in a consistent and clean manner.

13. STUDENTS DISCIPLINE

In order to protect the reputation of the student community, students should conduct themselves in a good manner both on and off the college campus.

1. Every student should wear clean clothes.
2. It is customary for students to greet their teachers for the first time inside the college campus.
3. Students must stand up when teachers enter the classroom and when they leave the classroom.
4. Students must leave only after their teacher dismisses the class.
5. Our students should not walk in the corridors in front of the classroom during class time.
6. Students should quietly go to the library if classes are not in session.
7. When going from one classroom to another, silence should be maintained.
8. Students should not be members of any forum, group or other unrelated organizations without the permission of the Principal. Do not engage in any activity that disrupts social harmony. Any student who is found to be acting in violation of these rules will be immediately expelled from the college.
9. Students should not hold or participate in meetings inside or outside the college campus without obtaining permission from the Principal. No donation should be collected.
10. Appropriate action will be taken against any student who breaks rules. The decision of the College Principal is final.
11. All the announcements will be communicated to the students through the notice board. Therefore, students have to check the reports pasted on the college notice board every morning and evening. No statement will be reported separately. Failure to see them shall not be accepted as a reason for not following the reference of the report.
12. Students should listen to the messages and instructions announced from time to time through the loudspeaker system installed in the principal's room and act accordingly.
13. Students should park their vehicles at the designated spot between 9.30 am and 2.00 pm subject to space availability.

14. Students should write their respective assignments in proper time and submit to the respective teachers. Check the notice boards in the room every day without fail to know the news about them. If mistakes are made without looking at them, the student will be penalized accordingly.
15. It is the duty of the student to come to the college on time and go to class after the bell rings. Late comers should take the permission of the Head of the department.
16. Students should not have any contact with the college office while studying in the college. They will not be allowed inside the college office.
17. Leave applications of students should not be sent directly to the Principal. It should be sent through proper authorisation.
18. Similarly, students who want to get train and bus fare concessions, conduct and course certificates should apply to the Principal through the appropriate responsible officers.
19. Do not write or mark anything on the wall inside the college premises. No writing on the desks and no posting of leaflets in the classroom. Breaking rules leads to punishment.
20. Students are prohibited from using cell phones in the college campus. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action. The cell phone will be confiscated and fined.
21. Strangers entering the college and the activities of disorderly students are monitored through the surveillance cameras installed in the college premises.

Note: Students who misbehave will be punished by the Principal under the Government Academic Rules. Any of the following punishments may be imposed:

1. Ordering repayment of penalty fee.
2. Suspension of students.
3. Expulsion of students from college.

14. DIRECT CONTACT SYSTEM

1. Each student is assigned to a Tutor-in-charge teacher to know about academic status and other statuses and get advice.
2. Students are divided into groups and a teacher is in charge of each group.
3. The teacher should know the complete information about all the students belonging to their group.
4. The In-charge will meet the students within the college premises at least once in a fortnight. He himself will communicate directly with the crew and the crew's parents or guardians when necessary.
5. The student should send all his leave applications with recommendation from the responsible tutor.
6. The tutor should keep a record of his student's residential addresses and other details.

15. COLLEGE EXAMS

1. Formal practice tests will be conducted in every Semester.
2. Students who do not appear for internal examinations without proper reason will not be able to get proper evidence of their academic progress and the same will be communicated to their parents.

16. COLLEGE LIBRARY

1. It works under the supervision of the Librarian.
2. It operates from 9.30 AM to 5.00 PM on working days.
3. Students can use the library by signing the attendance register at the entrance gate of the library.
4. All students can become a member of the library and get a library membership card.
5. A library card is issued only once per person.

6. You can get the book by presenting your library card. It should be returned within two weeks or on the date mentioned on the library card.
7. If the book is not delivered within the specified date, a penalty will be charged.
8. Do not lend the book to others.
9. If the book is lost, a penalty of double the price of the book will be charged.
10. Students will be instructed to return books promptly during sorting and cataloging.
11. Texts used for study reference are not allowed to be taken out.
12. The library card should be submitted to the library on the last working day and a proof of no dues should be obtained.
13. If the library card is lost the fine should be paid.
14. Get details about competitive exams. Library can also be accessed to apply online for competitive exams.
15. Students can also use the e-library in the public library. Computers with internet facilities can be used to check their departmental references.

17. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

1. All students of the college are members of the Physical Education Council.
2. The Advisory Committee of the Sports Forum consists of the Principal as the Chairman, the Director of Physical Education as the Secretary, the Patrons of the four sports teams, two student representatives nominated by the Principal, and the General President (Sports Committee) as members.
3. The Advisory Committee will meet to prepare the annual budget and implement necessary procedures.
4. The secretary is responsible for the purchase, maintenance and safekeeping of the sports equipment and for returning it to the stadium after receiving it properly. He/She will convene an advisory committee on an urgent basis, if necessary.

5. All expenses will be met from the amount collected for the Games, and the Secretary will have to get enough money in advance to hold several games with the permission of the Principal. A small incentive is paid to the clerk for maintaining these accounts.

Rules

1. Do not enter the playground without proper attire.
2. Students may not participate in any sports team or competition without the permission of the Director of Physical Education.
3. Students who do not attend classes regularly will not be included in the sports team.
4. No vehicle shall be allowed to drive on the surface of the playing field.
5. Students are responsible for the sports material provided to them.

19. NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The National Cadet Corps of our college is functioning as the 4th Company of Tamil Nadu 2nd Battalion. The student strength of the force is 104. There are 62 male students and 42 female students. Interested candidates will be selected through an interview by the Battalion Commander or his/her designee from among the first and second class students. 80 hours of

training in an academic year. Talented students are selected and sent to various camps. Those who have completed two years of training can write the B-Certificate exam and those who have completed three years of training can write the C-Certificate exam. These trainings and certifications will help you to join one of the three armed forces, the Police and the Indian Armed Forces.

Objectives

1. To develop good conduct, camaraderie, philanthropy and leadership among the students.
2. Encouraging national guard and imparting vocational training to students.
3. Training in assisting troops in times of national crisis during a neighboring invasion.
4. To strengthen the body and strengthen the soul to create proud, vibrant and energetic warriors.
5. To develop social responsibility, team spirit, good conduct, patriotism and sense of pride in work.
6. To impart knowledge on the principles and practices of military science and develop self-confidence, sense of responsibility and develop leadership qualities.

20. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The college has four National Service Scheme units. 100 students will be selected in each unit. These students must participate in 120 hours of welfare programs and 10 days of special camp in an academic year without fail. Students who have National Welfare Scheme Certificate are given the privilege to join police jobs and other government jobs.

THRIFT SOCIETY, TIRUCHIRAPPALLI**

Employees Co-operative Thrift Society in this college was registered on 09.05.1981 and has been functioning since 12.05.1981. All the permanent employees of College and Tiruchirappalli Zonal College under the Joint Directorate of Education can join this association. The Society shall collect from its members a minimum monthly savings of Rs.1,000/- to a maximum multiples of deduction and taking loan from District Central Co-operative Bank according to the salary of the members up to a maximum of Rs.12,00,000/- for a period of ten years. It works as per the interest fixing order issued by the government from time to time. Currently 9.5% interest on savings amount and 11.5% interest on loan amount is applicable. At present the association administration is functioning with an elected president, vice-president, 9 executive committee and a secretary.
