<p>Decentralization: The institution has a mechanism of providing operational autonomy to various functionaries in order to ensure a decentralized governance system. Principal is the member secretary of the governing body and chairperson of the IQAC. The Principal in consultation with the Teachers' Council nominates different committees for planning and implementation of different academic, student administration. All academic committees are based on the unanimous decision of the governing body, the IQAC and the teachers' council. Faculty members are given representation in various committees/cells work in the IQAC and other committees. Every year, the composition of different committees is changed to ensure a uniform exposure of duties for academic and professional development of faculty members. Students are empowered to play important role in different activities. Non-teaching staff are represented and their suggestions are considered while framing policies or taking important decisions.</p> <p>Participative management: The institution promotes the culture of participative management. The Principal, governing body, Teachers' council and the IQAC are involved in defining policies & procedures, framing guidelines and rules & regulations pertaining to admission, examination, discipline, grievance, support services, finance etc. Faculty members share knowledge among themselves, students and staff members while working for a committee. Principal and faculty members are involved in joint research and have published papers. The Principal interacts with government and external agencies & faculty members maintain interactions with the concerned departments of affiliating university. Students and office staff join hands with the Principal and faculty for the execution of different academic, administrative, extension related, co- and extracurricular activities.</p>

6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment
6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (with in 100 words each):
<p>❖ Curriculum Development:</p> <p>Curriculum designing and development is decided by the Controller's office in accordance with affiliating university. Faculty members interact in the Board of Studies and provide their views related to curriculum development. This will be passed by the academic committee. Department of English: Based on the current needs and trends, in the field of Language and Literature, the Board of Studies, Committee that was convened in March 2019 introduced new courses and updated the existing Courses. Our students are in need of exposure to Soft skills at the UG and PG levels. Hence the same was given importance. Seminar presentations are done by students in classrooms based on the syllabi.</p>
<p>❖ Teaching and Learning:</p> <p>Teaching and Learning is improved by adopting strategies like using computer aided methods, Seminars and conferences, workshops on development. Special lecture organized by Departments. Field tours organized by Botany, Zoology, Geography. Laboratory renovation, upgradation and purchase of equipment for science practical classes and building from RUSA fund. Organization of student seminar by departments for evaluation of students. ICT facility was increased in teaching learning process. As a Post accreditation initiative, all arts departments have been provided new computers and printers to increase the use of ICT enabled teaching and learning. Computer-aided methods are now used by majority of the departments to deliver lectures. Faculty members are encouraged to undertake refresher courses and publications in UGC required journals. The college implemented smart classes for effective teaching-learning process.</p>
<p>❖ Examination and Evaluation:</p> <p>Examination and Evaluation: Semester examinations are conducted. Internal assessment of students according to the university guidelines by having regular Class tests, student seminars.</p>
<p>❖ Research and Development</p> <p>Research and Development encouraging joint research by faculty members, which has resulted in their national and international joint publications. Encouraging faculty members to undertake major and minor research projects and disbursement of received research funds for purchase of items without delay. Faculty members are presently undertaking major and minor research projects funded by DST and ICSSR.</p>

❖ **Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation:**

As a post-NAAC initiative, the college has encouraged the use of ICT based techniques of study by arts departments. Computers have been allotted to different departments. The physical infrastructure has also received sincere attention from the college authority. Renovation and upgradation of laboratories, subscribing journals for the central library, Ladies waiting room construction, purchase of new computers, printers etc have been proposed and the details are given.

❖ **Human Resource Management :**

Students are encouraged to participate in seminars, special lectures, field tours, quiz, debate etc to increase their skill and experience. College organized special lecture to enrich students and staff in the academic year 2018-2019. Faculty members are encouraged to participate in trainings, workshops and staff development programmes. Different sub-committees are nominated by Teachers' Council to ensure academic and administrative experience of faculty members.

❖ **Industry Interaction / Collaboration :**

Faculty members have collaborated with national and international eminent academicians and researchers and published research papers in the current year.

❖ **Admission of Students :**

The admission process of 2018-2019 was purely counselling and students had to be physically present during the counselling. Subsequently, we follow the reservation policy by the state government. Admission of students commenced in May 2019 for 2019-20 after declaration of results of 10+2 examinations for UG programmes and after the declaration of UG results for the PG programmes.

College Profs 58+ is a unique – one of its kind – voluntary assembly of former faculty of this college, committed to serve the college community and its stake holders in all possible ways, purely on an honorary basis. Right from former faculty who served the college during the nascent stages (1964-65), faculty members who have served here at one or other stage of their career up to recently are in its fold. This unique group is in existence since 2018 and appreciable voluntary services are being carried out by them in the college, without incurring any expenditure on Govt./College funds.</div>						

As a first measure, the group undertook steps to enhance the aesthetics in the campus and contribute to the beautification of the College. Towards this, all the trees in the compound were pruned, as per technical advice and guidance from Forestry Department of the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University and protective white -coating mixed with insect- repellent has been carried out giving a fresh look throughout- from the college entrance. Apart from this, two beautiful Parks -one adjacent to the main building(சிந்தனைப்பொழில்) and another in front of the Lanka Building (தமிழ்ப்பொழில்) -both aesthetically fenced for protection- have been brought into existence and the gardens are blooming now presenting enhanced green and colours of nature.

The Founding Day of the College (24th August) is being celebrated by this group by organising useful lectures on education, facing competitive examinations, personality development for students. Regular week-end free coaching for competitive examinations for the benefit of the students are on the anvil. Courses on Communication, Personality Development during free time available for students will be there sooner.

The group managed to mobilize a fund of Rs 2 Lakhs, from the Common Good Fund of the Co-op Thrift and Credit Society of the College, through the good offices of the Jt. Registrar of Co-op Societies, Tiruchirappalli and the entire funds were used to successfully dig a yielding bore-well, establish water distribution lines and thus help mitigate the drinking water needs of the thousands of students in the College.

Not confining its efforts and initiatives to the college alone, during the Kaja Cyclone, this group sprang up to join the relief efforts being undertaken and contributed relief items in three instalments (Biscuits, Candles, Match Boxes, Lungis, Towels, Horlicks Pouches, Drinking Water Bottles and so on)through the District Collector, Tiruchirappalli. The group's functioning - philosophy is based on the inspiring term ' ஊர்கூடித்தேறிழுப்போம்' implying that all the efforts to serve the college and its community will be unitedly carried out, based totally on the free and voluntary will of the former faculty flocking together.

3. EMPLOYEES CO-OPERATIVE THRIFT & CREDIT SOCIETY LIMITED (Y.T.: 45)

The quality of using money and other resources carefully and not waste full. To help the government Employees by savings and loans. The Govt. Employees Co-operative Thrift and Credit Society Limited (YT 45) of Periyar EVR College, Trichy-23 is fostering the necessity of savings among the employees of Government Sector. On 09.05.1981, it was registered and is functioning from 12.05.1981 till date. The activities of this limited are governed by a President, Vice-President and nine Directors. Members of this society include: Teaching and Non-teaching fraternity of all Government Colleges (Trichy Region),

Prison Department of Tamil Nadu Police, Welfare (Social), Department of Govt. Examinations and Personnel from Law College, Trichy. Thrift and credit society meetings are conducted and the record of the account is maintained and audited.

It is a voluntary association usually unincorporated to promote thrift and for the collective investment of the savings of the members. Many of the Government staff members avail this facility by becoming the member of the society. Having 510 members as the strength, it renders services to its members with a facility of receiving loan of Rs.5 lakh as the maximum limit with rate of interest of 13.5%. By proper application they avail the loan amount without any difficulty in time.

The Thrift society is a separate entity and for the government employees of Tiruchirappalli district. It is functioning in our college campus. A full time officer is maintaining the accounts and conduct regular meetings. Yearly meeting is conducted during the festive season and the account is placed before the members. After the approval of the committee members, the dividend amount is given with a small incentive to all the members. They have common meetings at certain period. All the members from other districts meet at one place and discuss the regulations to be followed and to be changed.
